EASY

LEARN TO CROCHET COWL

MATERIALS

- Size P-15 (10mm) crochet hook
- 100 yards bulky weight yarn, such as Lamb's Pride Bulky (85% Wool, 15% Mohair; 125 yds; 4oz)
- Tapestry needle

MAKE THE COWL


Note: This cowl is made by crocheting a long rectangle. Once the rectangle is long enough to circle your neck comfortably, you'll fasten your yarn off and sew the short ends together to create a loop.

Chain (ch) 13, ch 1 (this is your turning chain, and counts as a single crochet (sc) stitch).

Sc in second ch from hook, and in each stitch across. Ch 1, turn. You should have 13 stitches. *(A friendly tip: I always have a hard time knowing where to start and end my rows; it can be very helpful to keep count as you go, at least until you get into the swing of things!)*

Repeat this last row until your piece measures about 24". Cut yarn, leaving a 30" long tail. Pull this tail back through the loop that's still on your hook, remove the hook and pull the tail tightly so that final stitch closes up around it.

Thread the tail onto your tapestry needle and use it to sew the short ends of your rectangle together, as shown below. Weave in ends.
